

Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) Training Program Overview



What is a Registered Behavior Technician?

- Practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a BCBA, BCaBA, or FL-CBA
- Primary responsibilities include direct implementation of skill acquisition and behavior reduction plans designed by the supervisor, collecting data, and conducting certain types of assessments
- Responsible for implementing, not designing, behavior plans

Why is the RBT credential important?

- School districts are challenged to employ enough BCBAs to serve students in a meaningful way
- Teachers and paras do not generally receive comprehensive training in the area of behavior

How do I become a Certified Registered Behavior Technician? What are the eligibility requirements for the RBT credential?

- At least 18 years of age
- Minimum of a high school diploma (or national equivalent)
- Successful completion of a criminal background registry check

- **Completion of a 40-hour training program**
 - **Conducted by a BCBA**
 - **Based on the RBT Task List**
- Passing the RBT Competency Assessment from approved testing center
- BACB Fees
 - \$50.00 application
 - \$45.00 testing fee

How does having Registered Behavior Technicians benefit schools?

- Builds capacity within a school district
- Increases competency of staff members and practitioners
- Increases consistent delivery of ABA in the classroom
- Increases quality of instruction and treatment to students
- Reduces costs of outside district supports
